LO: I can create a conversation between characters and record them in speech bubbles.

In the book – A Walk in London, the little girl and her mum visit lots of exciting places in London.
We read snippets of conversation in the book as the little girl narrates the journey they take.

Today you will create a conversation between mum and daughter in one of the places they visit in London. Look at the mother and daughter on page 13 where they are standing in the middle of Trafalgar Square. What could the little girl say to her mum? What might mum say?

LO: To observe features of living things and sort them into different groups.

Animals can be group in different ways according to their physical features. Below is an example of a branching database.

The questions always have a yes or no answer. It is the answer to a question that leads to another question.

For example we don't classify (or group) beetles in the same group as butterflies because they have different features. So you could ask: Does it have antennae? Yes/no

Does it have wings? Yes/no

Is the little girl excited? How do you know? Does she want to climb the lions and splash in the fountain? What would her mum say?


You could take some of the facts from the page and use this to create some speech for mum.
