#### Reminders from the office

**Admin team -** Mrs Parkin (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday & Friday and Dr Robinson (Wednesday). We would prefer you to call into the office at the beginning of the day with any queries. If you need to go to the office at the end of the day please call in before collecting your child as the school office closes at 3.30pm.

Absence - If your child is unwell or will be late, please email the school (admin@littleham.devon.sch.uk) or telephone the school (01395 266535) before 8.50am. If you know in advance that your child has a reason for absence (e.g. for a medical appointment) please ask the admin staff for an Absence Request Form at least a week in advance.

**Dinner Money -** School meals are £2.10 a day. Please bring dinner money to the school office in a clearly labelled envelope with your child's name on it. It is helpful if dinners are paid weekly on a Monday for all meals required that week.

**Trip Money/Permission Slips -** Please check your child's book bag daily for letters. Permission slips and any payment must be returned as soon as possible in an envelope clearly labelled with your child's name and trip name. Please ensure cheques are made payable to Devon County Council.

**Medicine** - If your child has a prescribed medicine that you need the school to administer during school hours, please bring to the school office and complete a medicine form.

**Contact Information -** We will send out data collection sheets in the autumn term for you to check the contact details we hold are up to date. These must be signed to confirm the details are correct and returned to the school office as soon as possible. If your telephone number or address changes during the year, please write the new details onto a piece of paper and pass to the office.

### **Supporting Learning in 2018**

We recognise that there are many parents who like to plan in learning around topics in school and thought we'd give you a sneaky peek of some of the learning in classes next term...

In Year 5 and 6, the children will be learning about British explorers including the slave trade. They will be exploring changing materials including dissolving, evaporating and condensing in science, and evolution link to Darwin in R.E.

In Year 4, the class will be learning about the Romans Empire and its impact on Britain. They will explore legacy and inventions as we travel back time.

In Year 3 the children will be learning about food from around the world. They will focus on the similarities and differences between food production from different places in the world.

In Year 2 the topic is Reduce, Reuse and Recycle. They will be learning about the importance of reducing, reusing and recycling and how we can do that at home and in school. This links to RE, caring for all God's creatures and the planet. They are hoping to have workshops, a visit to a recycling plant, 'up-cycle' unused items, and create art with junk.

In Year 1, the overarching theme is 'winter wonderland'. They will be learning about the Arctic and Antarctic and what lives there and why, as well as creating snowy fantasy worlds.

### Inspiring a love of learning

Well done to Years 5 and 6 who have been inspiring younger children in school with their learning about the Saxon and Viking struggle for Britain. As part of their learning, they were able to choose an area of Viking life to learn about either independently or with a friend. Examples of learning included Viking clothing, modelled on dolls, Viking boats, weapons, food and houses. Their learning culminated in an afternoon when other classes came down to share the learning, play with some of the models and talk with their older school friends about what they had learned. What role models you are!

### **National Takeover Day**

As part of our on-going focus on British Values, in particular understanding the importance of democracy, the children in Year 6 had a wonderful opportunity to experience the decisions making process in a unique, hands-on way this week.

As part of a National Takeover Day, the children experienced what is was like to run public services such as Environmental Health, the Council Chambers, Community Development and Waste and Recycling at Sidmouth Council Offices.

The children started in the council chambers debating whether 500 new houses should be allowed to be built in the town. Poor Mrs Cambridge, aka Councillor Ivor Butchers, took a battering from many Councillors as she promoted the building of the new houses. Councillor Stan Still aka Zac Godden even suggested the butchers shop be knocked down! Councillor Mark High (Joshua Traveres) calmed the heated debate down with a suggestion of 250 houses and the development of green spaces and parks.

We had great fun as Environmental Health officers going into a kitchen to perform an inspection. All condemned the kitchen and closed it down after the discovery of blocked drains, broken plates, rats and mice, raw and cooked meat left out and out of date food.

Thank you to Sidmouth Council for giving Year 6 such a fun and engaging day.
