We have been focusing on which months are in Winter in class. As next month is March, so we will focus on that and the months of Spring. March, April and May. Use the song to identify those months. Also, re-visit which month your birthday is in and what it is like. Activity - Draw and colour in the empty March balloon in the paper packs. When have you had to forgive someone for doing something wrong? How about saying sorry for something you might have done wrong? Setting up an obstacle race in a garden if you have got one, or timed runs etc in a park. Being active for one minute bursts would be useful, in linking with our Maths using time. Asking the children to do an aerobic activity for what they think is a minute to get a sense of time.
