Family Learning Coffee and chat

It has been great to see so many parents and children working and learning together this term. On Tuesday 24th April, 1.30 pm to 3.00 pm, we are holding a *Coffee and Chat* where you can discuss the course, ideas to make learning literacy fun, help your child and understand their school work and gain qualifications for yourself. Please note it is for parents and carers only for this introductory session.

Operation Encompass

The school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and Devon and Cornwall Police. *Operation Encompass* is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

The children followed Darrell's lead and collaborated to produce two amazing pieces of art, a replica owl/school logo and of course a dinosaur. The day also provided children with the opportunity to handle fossils and find out more about the Jurassic coast, learn more about Exmouth Museum, get up close to birds of prey, have a go at pottery not to mention enter a competition to create the best dinosaur.
